

RECOMMENDATIONS MOVING FORWARD

Similar to the results observed in the year following proclamation of mandatory reporting of child pornography in Manitoba, the statistics from the 2010/11 year underscore the importance of training, education and public awareness. Throughout 2011/12, the Canadian Centre for Child Protection will continue to pursue the following objectives:

- Provide training for child welfare professionals as it relates to child pornography;
- Engage in public awareness activities including public awareness campaigns;
- Develop and distribute educational materials;
- Conduct research and engage in advocacy efforts related to the issue; and
- Continue to make improvements to the Child Welfare Portal and Cybertip.ca system.

At the conclusion of the 2011/12 year (three years following proclamation), the Canadian Centre for Child Protection will complete a detailed analysis outlining additional recommendations tied to increased awareness of mandatory reporting in order to facilitate the reporting of children potentially in need of protection.
